Denver Harbor Hosts Fundraiser for Local Schools at Riverhouse Houston

Neighbors, educators, and community leaders gathered on April 14 at Riverhouse Houston for the *Denver Harbor Cares About Education Fundraiser*, an event organized to support local students through three neighborhood-based organizations: Denver Harbor Cares, Resurrection Catholic School, and Harbor Christian Academy.

Denver Harbor Cares organized the event, which combined community storytelling, civic recognition, and entertainment to raise funds for educational programs in the area. Proceeds from the evening will go directly toward expanding academic support and student services at the partner schools.

Cathy Hernandez, anchor and reporter with KPRC 2 News, served as emcee. The evening opened with a color guard presentation by the Sember Fi #3 Memorial Honor Detail, followed by an invocation led by Pastor Andrew Johnson of Faith Memorial Baptist Church.

Longtime residents took the stage to reflect on the value of investing in youth. Roy Zermeno, a lifelong Denver Harbor resident and retired AT&T employee, shared stories of growing up in the neighborhood and underscored the importance of education as a pathway to community stability. Carolyn Lopez, La Voz Editor, President of Denver Harbor Cares, and retired Chief Deputy with Harris County Precinct 6, offered updates on local initiatives, including zoning protections, blood drives, and continued volunteer outreach.

Several local sponsors were recognized throughout the evening. Businesses like Reytec Construction Resources, Compean Funeral Home, Irma's Original and Southwest Grill, and D.H. Tire were applauded for their ongoing involvement in the neighborhood. Houston Community College was also acknowledged for expanding access to higher education and workforce training. Judge Richard Vara, a retired Justice of the Peace and civic mainstay, was recognized for decades of service.

Harris County Sheriff Ed Gonzalez delivered the keynote address, reflecting on his roots in the area and connecting public safety to community investment. Gonzalez emphasized that education is among the most effective tools for long-term crime prevention and neighborhood well-being.

Later in the evening, attendees viewed pre-recorded video messages from elected officials who could not attend in person. Commissioner Adrian Garcia, District H Council Member Mario Castillo, and State Senator Carol Alvarado voiced support for the community and its youth-focused goals. Other local officials present included Congresswoman Sylvia Garcia, State Representative Ana Hernandez, and Council Members Julian Ramirez, Sallie Alcorn, and Willie Davis

The night included a raffle featuring prizes from Riverhouse Houston, Porras Pronto, and Don Chile Mexican Restaurant. Principals Cindy Suarez (Resurrection Catholic School) and John Bryant (Harbor Christian Academy) briefly addressed the crowd before drawing winners and thanking attendees for their support.

Rene Porras, Vice President of Denver Harbor Cares, delivered closing remarks. A Vietnam veteran and owner of Porras Pronto, Porras spoke about the power of sustained, grassroots action and the need for communities to show up, especially for their children. Social Security Customer Service Crisis Puts Spotlight on New Social Security Commissioner

Social Security has struggled with customer service for years. Declining staffing and funding has seen the Social Security Administration (SSA) leaving Texans in the lurch, dealing with long wait times on the phone and in Social Security offices, getting busy signals on the phone, or sometimes simply being unable to reach anyone for their customer service needs. SSA scrapped a service change last week that would have forced many Texans to have to go in-person to a Social Security office for routine services that have been handled over the phone. While we're encouraged that SSA is listening to concerns about customer service, we're not going to take potential improvements for granted. The incoming Social Security Administrator needs to focus on delivering effective and efficient customer service to everyone who needs access to Social Security.

It's a win for people across the country that SSA backtracked on their harmful proposed cuts to phone service, but this kind of disarray from the Social Security Administration has led to people around the country confused and anxious about the status of Social Security. Call volume to SSA has increased substantially at the same time that fewer people are getting resolutions to their problems.

It's no secret that the Social Security Administration has experienced a customer service crisis for years. Perhaps no organization has been more outspoken about the need to tackle it than AARP. Yet call wait times, hold times, and customer service resolutions have been inconsistent for years, according to SSA's own data.

It doesn't help that Congress hasn't provided the funding necessary to ensure Social Security can deliver quality customer service. In fact, funding to improve the program has long been on the decline. SSA funding has dropped by 9% since 2018.

This year, wait times are on the rise, fewer people can reach a Social Security representative to meet their needs, and this challenge emerges just as more people – approximately 10,000 people every day – are retiring.

The Social Security Administration has been too unclear and uncommunicative with the public about its customer service issues in 2025. From their backtracking on phone service changes to confusion over office closures, SSA's public controversies have drive anxiety for Americans everywhere. Phone calls to the agency have spiked over the last few months, and if they don't commit to customer service improvements, it's going to cause real hardship for many older Americans trying to get the Social Security they have earned.

The incoming Social Security Commissioner would be well served by re-committing the Social Security Administration to providing timely, efficient and effective customer service. SSA needs to be clear when communicating any possible changes, and what effects that lower staffing levels will have. And Congress needs to provide oversight to ensure that customer service is prioritized at an agency that has struggled to serve Americans everywhere.

We encourage everyone in Texas to join us in calling for SSA to ensure everyone receives the Social Security service they need for a vital program for Americans everywhere.

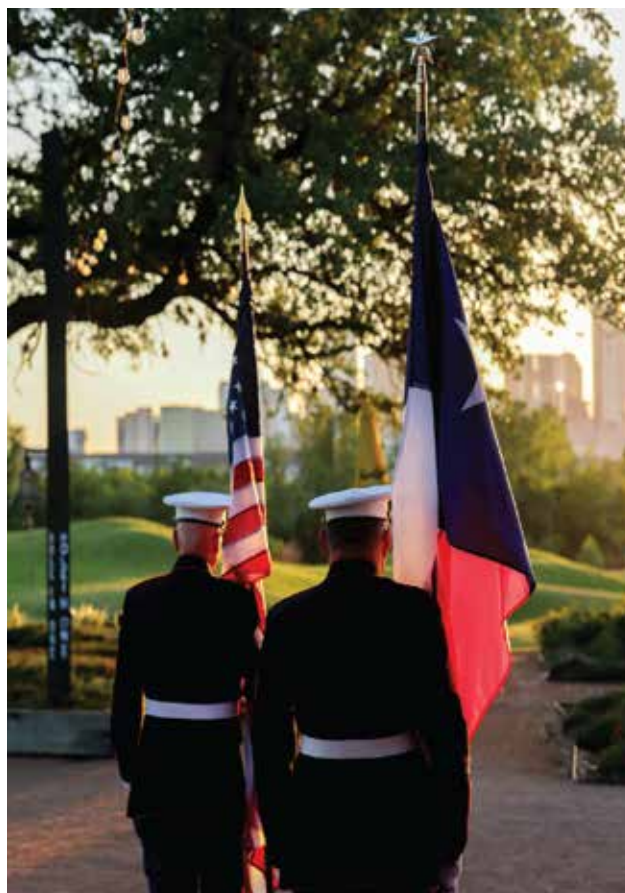
As Memorial Day approaches we

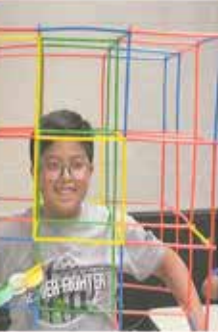
